Stalin Lloyd Lloyd George Lead Britain to victory in World War 1 in 1918 and remained Prime Minister until 1922. George V George Frederick Ernest Albert; 3 June 1865 – 20 January 1936 was King of the United Kingdom from 6 May 1910 until his death in 1936. George VI December 14, 1895 to February 6, 1952, crowned as king of the United Kingdom in 1937, was an important symbolic leader for the British people during World War II. He supported Winston Churchill completely throughout the war and even visited armies on the battle fronts
