<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Make a habitat for an animal.• Make an animal mask.• Make an animal print/pattern.• Use some spring objects to create a picture or collage• Draw a picture of a flower. Remember to draw some petals, a stem and some leaves on your flower.• Draw or paint a picture of some flowers. What colours do you need?• It will soon be Easter. Draw or paint a picture of an Easter egg.• People celebrate Easter by eating chocolate or cakes. Try making a sweet treat to share with your family. Take a picture of any treats that you make.• Make a basket to hold some Easter treats and decorate it.• Make a thank you card.• Make rice crispy cakes and decorate them with mini eggs.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Talk about the New Year and write or draw any resolutions you would like to make.• 'Bin' rhymes with 'tin'. Can you think of more words that rhyme with 'bin'? Can you find more than five?• Write adjectives to describe a creepy crawly.• Write a list of animals you might find at the zoo.• Make and write a Valentine's Day card.• Write your numbers from 1-20• Write words to describe spring.• Egg starts with the letter 'e' what else starts with the letter 'e'? Write a list of these words.• Write your name on a thank you card.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• During spring lots of animals have their babies. Find out the names of these baby animals: duck, pig, sheep, cow and horse.• What animals you might find at a farm?• Hetty the Hen had 10 eggs. On Monday 4 eggs hatched into chicks. How many eggs were left in Hetty's nest?• What flowers grow in the spring? Can you find out what they are called?• What do flowers need to grow? Draw a picture of these things and label them?• Find out what animals would make good pets and why.• Find out what fruit and vegetables grow in spring.• Find out how we celebrate Easter.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Go on a spring walk with a grown up and collect some spring objects; flowers, leaves etc.• Draw a picture of what you saw on your spring walk. What signs of spring did you see?• Make a weather chart for a week to show what the weather is like. Draw a picture to show what the weather is like each day• During spring seeds begin to grow. In the story of Jack and the Beanstalk, Jack's beans grow into a magical beanstalk. Act out and retell the story of Jack and the Beanstalk to a grown-up at home.• Try growing some plants or flowers at home. You could plant some seeds in a pot or in a garden.• Visit Tam O'Shanter farm.
