

	Equator	The Equator is an imaginary circle around Earth. It divides Earth into two equal parts: the Northern Hemisphere and the Southern Hemisphere.	
	Region	A region is an area of land that has common features A region can be defined by natural or artificial features. Language, government, or religion can define a region , as can forests, wildlife, or climate.	
	The Andes	The longest mountain range in the world and boasts some of the highest peaks.	
	Amazon River	The River Amazon in South America is the largest river by discharge of water in the world, and the second in length.	
	Colony	A colony is a group of people from one country who build a settlement in another territory, or land. They claim the new land for the original country, and the original country keeps some control over the colony .	
	Continent	A continent is a massive area of land that is separated from others by water or other natural features
